Review: Peter Pan - The Never Ending Story World Arena Tour at Birmingham NIA



Hook fights Peter Pan in the NIA's production of Peter Pan, The Never Ending Story.

The classic story of the boy who never grows old never grows old.

Especially when J.M. Barrie's fairytale gets the state-of-the-art treatment in this action packed production, which debuted in Birmingham on Friday night.

Spectacular fireworks put the pirate into pyrotechnics, while special effects bring the show to life.

The computer-generated backdrop is so realistic that the scenes at sea even left the kids feeling queasy, unless it was all the ice cream and fizzy pop they enjoyed at the interval.

Set to a musical score from Madness to Nessun Dorma to Duran Duran, the high energy performance barely stops for breath.

Kian Egan might have been flying without wings when the Westlife singer won the latest series of I'm a Celebrity last weekend.

But former queen of the jungle, Stacey Solomon, is flying with wings as Tinker Bell.

Solomon is the unseen narrator for much of the production, but when she does finally make an appearance, to belt out Westlife's You Raise Me Up, her cameo is well worth waiting for.

Although Solomon provides the X-Factor, it is Sandor Sturbl as Peter and Lilly-Jane Young as Wendy who carry artistic director Geert Allaert's show with strong performances, ably supported by the most acrobatic of casts, including John (Gerardo Tetilla) and Michael (Davide Romeo) Darling.

My swashbuckling five-year-old son found Captain Hook (Milan Van Weelden) and his cronies to be suitably wicked, while my discerning three-year-old daughter preferred the light relief of larger-than-life dog Nana and Tick Tock Croc.

The production is at the NIA tonight and tomorrow.

"Peter Pan the never ending story" had even goed ook "Hook" kunnen heten. Want in deze familievoorstelling die toch minder geschikt is voor de allerjongsten is een uitstekende Milan Van Weelden zeer aanwezig. Hij vult Vorst Nationaal met zijn krachtige stem op de tonen van Rossini's Largo al factotum en Puccini's Nessun Dorma. Op vlak van visuals is deze voorstelling een pareltje geworden. Ook de kostuums die van de hand zijn van de betreunde Kaat Tilley zijn weldoordacht, en roepen een magische sfeer op of voelen erg Brits aan bij de familie Darling bijvoorbeeld. Windturbines en andere speciale effecten kunnen helaas niet verhinderen dat we niet in het verhaal meegezogen worden. Daarvoor is de show te veel een vertelling, met een te grote rol voor vertelster Kathleen Aerts. Peter Pan oogt dus nog steeds te veel als een aaneenschakeling van scènes die wat aan elkaar gepraat worden dan als een geheel waar je je als toeschouwer kan in onderdompelen.

De acteurs moeten het stellen met zang of mime. Enkel Sandor Strübl heeft gesproken tekst op een wel erg cruciaal moment. Tinkelbel die het gif van kapitein Haak innam om zo Peter te redden, kan enkel nog gered worden door een stevig geloof in elfjes. Strübl bespeelt op dat moment met zijn aanstekelijk jonge enthousiasme het publiek, laat het een ovatie geven en scanderen "Ik geloof in elfjes". Een prachtig moment van interactie, maar jammer genoeg ook het enige in de ganse show. Uitblinkers in hun mimospel zijn ontegensprekelijk John Darling (Gerardo Tetilla) en Michael Darling (Davide Romeo) die clowneske fratsen uithalen op de Bühne.

Komen nauwelijks of niet uit de verf: Sara De Smedt als Mrs Darling. Haar "Almost there" blijft te hoog gegrepen en haar stem blendt voor geen meter met die van Wim Van Den Driessche als Mr. Darling in "Oh my love". Compleet overbodig is de Nederlandse Marjolein Van Haren als de zeemeermin. Slechts enkele minuten verschijnt ze op het podium om een "Mad about you" neer te zetten die ons zielsveel doet verlangen naar Noémie Wolfs of Geïke Arnaert. Haar versie sneed langs geen kanten en het effect met de staart boven de windturbine werkt niet. Ook de productie lijkt dat stilaan door te hebben dat het een geklooi van jewelste is. Slechts enkele seconden hangt Van Haren nog boven de turbine.

De Brit Matt Dunkley – die eerder tekende voor de muziek bij de film Moulin Rouge – ging het niet te ver zoeken. Meer dan de helft van de songs uit de voorstelling is Brits. Slechts 1 nummer, dat van Hooverphonic, draagt een Belgische stempel. Of hoe Britten chauvinisten zijn, die anno 2012 hun eigen Britse muziekscène nog steeds overwaarderden en de Belgische productie die blijkbaar te weinig chauvinistisch is, dit zo maar liet gebeuren. On-be-grij-pe-lijk. Verder koos Dunkley voor opvallend veel ballads en midtempo songs die weliswaar perfect bij het verhaal passen maar ook de vaart uit de show halen.

Erg blij zijn we dat de rol van Tiger Lily groter werd in vergelijking met de previews. De Franse Julia Guez heeft een erg warm timbre dat ons erg kon bekoren. Maar net als vele andere personages, zoals de Darlings, Smee én de zeemeermin is ook het hare te weinig uitgewerkt en blijft haar bijdrage tot het geheel miniem.

Op vocaal vlak is de Britse Lilly-Jane Young een ontdekking. De manier waarop ze "One day I'll fly away" van de Amerikaanse Randy Crawford zingt, bezorgt ons kippenvol. Ook "Forever Young" van het Duitse Alphaville zet ze met Strübl piekfijn neer. Die laatste mag een aanstekelijk schaduwgevecht leveren op "In the shadows" van het Finse The Rasmus. Dat levert een sterk staaltje aan visuals op met verwijzingen naar Pinokkio en ET. Het moet gezegd dat dé sterkte van Peter Pan voornamelijk het werk is van datgene wat Dirty Monitor (projection content, mapping and animations) samen met Luc Peumans en Christian Stenuit die de belichting voor hun rekening namen, creëerden.

Andere straffe vondsten zijn walvissen die rondzwemmen en lucht uitademen via hun spuitgaten. Dat effect wordt nagebootst door CO2-jets. Voorts leveren Peter Pan en kapitein Haak ondersteboven een gevecht, breekt Peter Pan door een muur en vallen de indianen na een aanval van kapitein Haak in slow motion omver. Daarbovenop komen nog de illusies van Jack Cooper die de broertjes Darling laat zweven in dozen en de vele acrobatieën met onder andere bungee-technieken en menselijke torens. Ogen komen we dus te kort bij deze Peter Pan. Mochten we deze voorstelling nog een derde keer bekijken, we zouden wellicht nog links en rechts iets ontdekken.

Maar net dat voordeel, is ook een nadeel. Peter Pan verzuipt in de details. Scènes aan het treinstation, de kruissteek met Peters schaduw, de zeemeermin,... - hoe knap ze visueel ook werden gebracht - voelen als vullertjes aan die niets of nauwelijks iets toevoegen aan het verhaal. Er had dus meer geschraapt gemogen, zelfs bijrollen mochten tegen het licht gehouden worden.

Peter Pan speelt nog tem januari in Vorst Nationaal en staat op 15 en 16 februari 2013 in de Ziggo Dome. Later reist de productie – met 28 trucks aan materiaal die daarmee groter is dan Madonna's MDNA-tour die er 20 op de baan had- naar de UK en Duitsland.

Peter Pan tour is a visual delight

This big-budget production of the fairy tale story is visually stunning with huge screens and special effects transforming the audience into a fantasy world with crocodiles, the Lost Boys and Captain Hook.



Based in the centre of the arena, Victorian London and Neverland are created through images on huge screens and specialist lighting. The energetic cast run frantically around the huge space and appear through trap doors to keep the action moving swiftly.

Featuring pop songs from Robbie Williams, Duran Duran and the like, it has a touch of the modern about it too. Peter Pan (Sandor Sturbl) is a frolicking elfen character with the hairdo and charm of Harry Styles from One Direction. While Wendy (Lilly Jane Young) is an enigmatic, gutsy gal fighting the pirates in trainers. Both have fabulous voices.

Meanwhile, it's refreshing to see dastardly Captain Hook as an opera buff singing arias as he carries out his evil antics.

Popular singer Stacey Solomon was promoted heavily as Tinker Bell for the performance in Birmingham, and while her voice is heard narrating the tale from start to finish, it's disappointing that she only appears to perform one song towards the end of the story.

Despite just the one song - You Lift Me Up - the former X Factor and I'm A Celebrity Get Me Out of Here contestant performs it well and gets one of the biggest cheers of the night as she is an obvious crowd-puller.

The real highlight though is the special effects and gymnastics on stage. There's beautiful imagery involving Indian Tiger Lily with dancers shaping themselves to look like windcatchers. While the Lost Boys perform breathtaking acrobats and balance high up towards the arena roof.

Then there is the huge crocodile, which creeps into the arena with its glowing eyes and delights both the children and older members of the audience. Manned by at least ten people under its green exterior, it steals the show.

Much has been made of seeing Peter Pan fly "without a harness" and there are sections of the show when he is blown into the air by a powerful wind turbine, but it's more of a gimmick than actually adding much to the show. The rest of the time Peter and Wendy are flying about on strings and that doesn't spoil the essence of this wonderful tale.

It was interesting to see that in Birmingham, this fairytale attracted many local celebrities with their children including singer Jamelia, rugby player Ben Cohen - fresh from his stint on Strictly Come Dancing - and motoring expert Quentin Willson.

But on such a big scale, the show at Birmingham NIA felt a bit too removed from the audience, and while it contained all the ingredients for a spectacular, there was something slightly lacking to make it truly memorable.

The tour now continues to venues across the UK.

A Review of Peter Pan at RWS - The Never Ending Story

Many of us grew to love Peter Pan and his adventures from the iconic animated film produced by Walt Disney in 1953. However, few know the history of the titular character dates back to when J.M. Barrie wrote the play "Peter Pan, or the Boy Who Wouldn't Grow Up" in 1904. Since then, there have been many other adaptations but nothing quite like this musical.

Conceptualised by Geert Allaert and his team from Music Hall Production, Peter Pan: The Never Ending Story makes its Asian premiere at Resorts World Sentosa after a successful run in Europe. It takes this well-known classic into the modern realm by re-imagining the adventures of Peter Pan and his friends through chart-topping pop songs and slick choreography.

In this production, Tinkerbell is the narrator and she takes us through Peter Pan's journey, from meeting Wendy, John and Michael Darling in London, to bringing them to Neverland and finally, to the epic sword fight against Captain Hook.

I was impressed by the incredible scale of the production from the moment the show started. With acrobatic stunts, stunning pyrotechnics and that little bit of "fairy dust", I was "hooked" into re-discovering all the things I already loved about Peter Pan. I loved that the set was made up of movable giant books and visual effects that added a whimsical touch to the story-telling.

This musical wouldn't be anything without the music - literally. Peter Pan: The Never Ending Story has no dialogue and as such, the songs had to tell us the story. With his experience on films such as Moulin Rouge and The Great Gatsby, the Musical Director, Matt Dunkley did a brilliant job in re-working popular songs for the musical.

On the opposite end of the spectrum, the chemistry between real-life husband and wife, Sandor Stürbl and Lilly-Jane Young, who play Peter Pan and Wendy Darling respectively, is palpable. When they duet on songs like "Forever Young" and "Kiss From A Rose", something magical happens - you can feel how much they mean to each other, both on and off the stage.

After all, Stürbl proposed to Young on stage after a performance of this very musical in Glasgow, so you know that this musical is special to them. I definitely felt it and don't tell anyone this, but I teared up a little every time they sang together.

While it can be a little draggy at times, especially with the elaborate and sometimes repetitive dance sequences used as transitions from scene to scene, this Cirque du Soleil-esque take on a classic does enough to keep the story fresh for audiences. Regardless, there is an impeccable polish to the production that everyone can appreciate.

Ultimately, it's a wholesome production for the family in which kids will enjoy all the high-flying action and adults will feel nostalgic when they hear the songs. This makes Peter Pan: The Never Ending Story perfect for the young and the young at heart.

Even though the story is far from new, it still manages to keep audiences on the edge of their seats as they uncover the nefarious schemes of Hook and capture their hearts as they discover the blossoming love story between Peter Pan and Wendy Darling. At the end of it all, this 20-something year old adult sure enjoyed being a kid again. Especially when Wendy flew above my head and waved at me.

Never in my life would I have imagined Peter Pan singing "Angel" by Robbie Williams - but it worked. Other songs like "You Raise Me Up" by Josh Groban and "One Day I'll Fly Away" by Nicole Kidman will get you singing along in no time, as I found myself mouthing the words to a lot of the songs.

However, it is also in the lack of dialogues that I found problematic. With the little narration that was provided by a mostly unseen Tinkerbell, I was often left a little confused at what was happening in each scene. I had to piece a lot of the plot points together and if I didn't already know the story of Peter Pan, I might have been left a little stranded. It was at this point that I realised how this musical was more suited for younger audiences who would be more fascinated by the visual elements of the production.

credit to this great story as the narrator. It's scary, but it's going to be an incredible challenge.

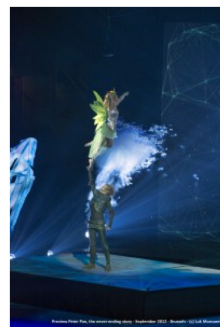

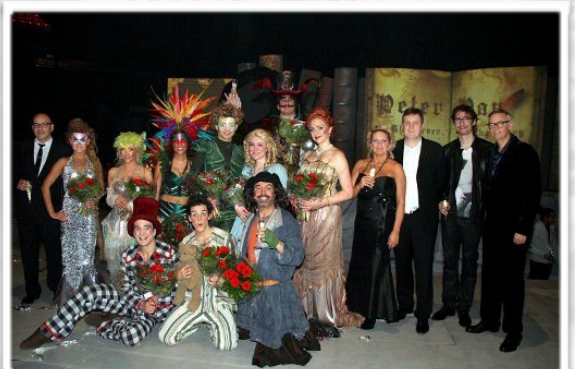
Müller said a venue such as a theatre allows the audience to focus on the actors. The actors will also be able to act more naturally than in an arena where they need to make big movements.

As this is a 2-hr musical (with 20-min intermission) staged for audiences aged from 4 year old to as long as you feel young, the content has skewed towards adult maturity rather than keeping it simple for young children. I heard lots of questions from the 4-5 year old child behind me. My 5 year old son doesn't know much about what is happening too except knowing the key characters, the excitement of acrobatics and flying performance, and the pyrotechnics used. He was mesmerized throughout. However he needed me to explain to him about the plot as the show progressed because when i asked him question about certain scenes, he would reply with “why” without moving his eyes off the stage. However the bunch of 7 year olds (K and her play mates) could enjoy the story as well as adults. Because K sat with her besties while I sat with R, I tested her after the show and found that she had digested what she watched pretty well.
